Little Falls Parkway Now Closed to Motor Vehicle Traffic on Weekends

Montgomery Parks is continuing its efforts to expand safe access to park facilities for exercise during the COVID-19 crisis. Beginning on Friday, April 17, Little Falls Parkway between Massachusetts Avenue and Arlington Road will be closed to motor vehicles and open to pedestrians, bicyclists, and other park users from Friday mornings at 9 a.m. through Sunday evenings at 6 p.m. every weekend. 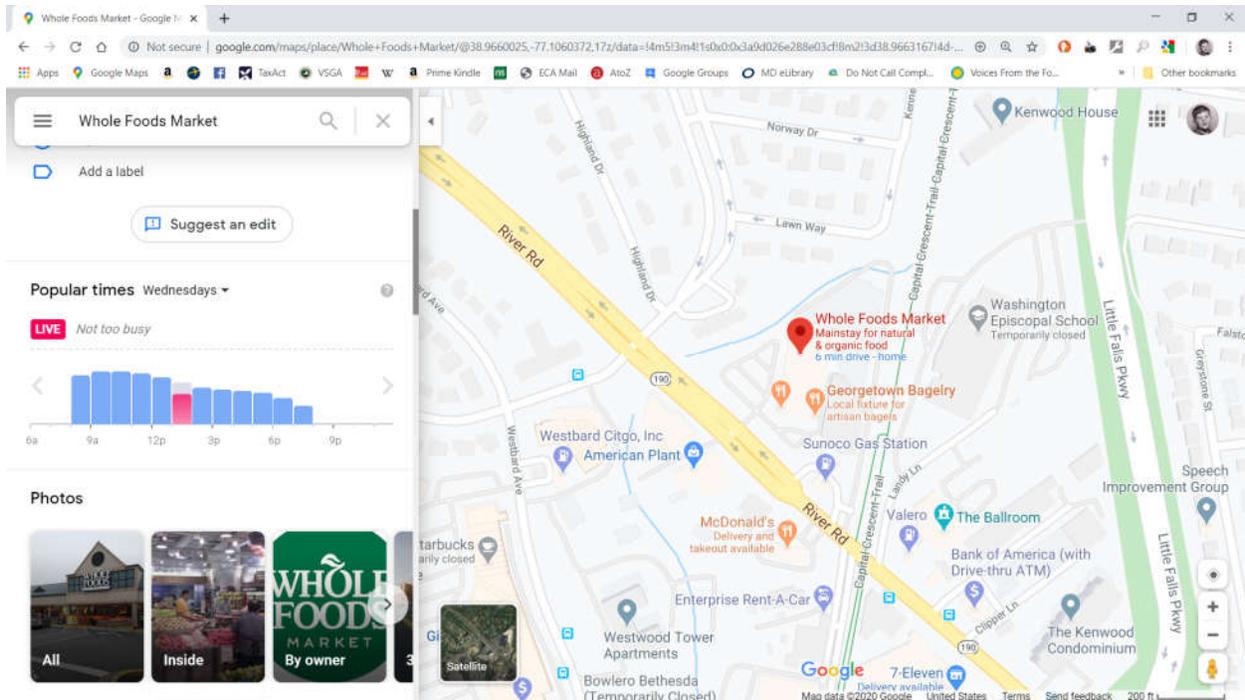

Edgemoor Tip of the Month – Google Maps' Popular Times Feature

Have you been thinking of and outing to the grocery store or some other open business, but worried about whether you'll be able to shop there without it being too crowded for safety? You should try Google Maps' Popular Times feature. It won't answer the question completely for you, but it can give you some helpful information to help you make a decision. On the map, click on the business you're interested in. As you may already know, you'll then see information about the business (a photo, ratings, a description of the business...) on a new window on the left side of the screen. If you scroll down on that new window, you'll see lots of other information, including a segment titled "Popular times." It contains a bar graph showing, on average, how busy that business is each hour of the day (blue bars). In addition, it will have a red bar show how busy it is currently. This can help you with your decision about whether or not to go now, or wait for another time. Here is a screen shot showing the Whole Foods on River Road a little after 1 PM on Wednesday this week:



Note that the blue bars shows that, on Wednesdays, the store is usually the least busy from 7 until 8 PM. The red bar show that, when I was looking at it, the store was less crowded than usual for that time.
