## Residential Parking Permit Enforcement Suspended

Montgomery County Department of Transportation announced on March 22 that it was making additional changes to its previously announced parking rule relaxations during the COVID-19 Health Crisis. Enforcement has been suspended in Residential Permit zones that consist of non-metered on-street parking with posted signage requiring residential permits for parking.
