

Annual Membership Meeting of the Edgemoor Citizens Association

May 14, 2018

Minutes

Board Members Present: David Barnes (President), Jeffrey Drichta, Joyce Gwadz, Julie Clark, Susan Hendrickson

The annual membership meeting of the ECA was called to order by the President.

Business discussed

1. ECA Junk Collection Day — The Board reported on the successful junk collection last weekend. The event was sponsored by BOA and the Wydler Brothers Realty.
2. Treasurer's Report on Membership and Budget — The Board reported that the ECA had a successful membership renewal campaign this year. The ECA has approximately 345 of the 500 households as members, approximately 700 people. A printed version of the neighborhood directory is in progress and will be printed this year. Currently it is scheduled to be released in June.
3. Upcoming Primary Election — The official ballot proofs for the upcoming primary were distributed as a convenience to members. The ECA itself is a nonpartisan organization. Tuesday June 26th is Election Day, but early voting as well as absentee voting is available.
4. Future Use of Edgemoor Club Facilities

The Board reported on recent discussions with the Board of the Edgemoor Club. The Club has been revisiting consideration of the impact of clubhouse usage and the associated costs to the Club. However, the Edgemoor Club Board approved allowing the ECA to use the clubhouse at no cost for 5 events for 2 hours each: 2 member meetings annually, Halloween party, Fourth of July and New Year's Brunch (assuming no conflict with Edgemoor club events). Because of concerns about liability, the Club indicated that it can no longer let the ECA use the pool as part of its Fourth of July event. The Board reported that the Board of the Edgemoor Club was very welcoming to the ECA and that the Board of the Club indicated that it is happy to continue the longstanding neighborly relationship with the ECA.

5. Edgemoor Parking Permits

The Board also reported on the digital parking permits. The digital parking website is currently in the process of being updated and will be revised. Physical (vs digital) parking stickers are not required. Also, there will be an increase in the visitor parking permits from one to two.

6. Member's Choice - Open Discussion

The Board opened up the discussion to the membership for any issues that the members wanted to discuss. The topics discussed included: (1) helicopter traffic in the neighborhood; (2) the redesigned of the intersection of Clarendon, Fairfax & Manning; (3) the new Crosswalk at Bethesda Ave and Arlington; and (4) a report of rat pellets in the area.

At the conclusion of the discussion the meeting adjourned.
