### <u>Little Falls Parkway Update</u>

As mentioned in last month's Newsletter, Little Falls Parkway has been reconfigured yet again between Dorset Avenue and Arlington Road, The roadway is now two lanes (one in each direction) on one side of the median strip and no motor vehicle traffic on the other side. This is just the beginning of a longer term project to build a new "linear park" along the now vacant side of the parkway. You find more details about the project <u>HERE</u>.

A couple of days ago, I took part in a meeting organized by the Montgomery County Department of Transportation to gather community input about the current traffic configuration. Highlights of the meeting:

• The purpose of the project is to add much-needed recreational space in an area where land is at a premium next to the Capital Crescent Trail, one of the most popular trails in Montgomery Parks' system. The new linear park is expected to have room for not only pedestrians and bicyclists, but also (to be added next spring) seating, games, and other social and recreational amenities. The current

- configuration is essentially a pilot project, and Parks will seek input from residents and evaluate the success of the pilot next summer.
- The parkway is under the jurisdiction of Montgomery Parks, not the Department of Transportation, and the decision to convert the parkway to a linear park was made by Parks. Their original intent was to close the entire parkway to vehicle traffic. The current approach, retaining one motor vehicle lane in each direction, was proposed by DOT as a compromise in order to reduce the traffic impact on nearby neighborhoods. The purpose of the community meeting was to hear comments and concerns about the current configuration.
- Residents at the meeting expressed concern about the decision to close a portion of the parkway and the way Montgomery Parks arrived at that decision. Other concerns included:
  - Safety issues at several locations caused by insufficient signage, traffic light locations that don't reflect the current lane directions, and vehicle backups at some locations.
  - Cut-through traffic has improved as compared to times when the entire parkway was closed, but remains a big problem.
  - o Reduction of the parkway from 4 to 2 lanes affects not only nearby residential streets, but other alternative routes like Goldsboro Road.
