Montgomery Lane/Montgomery Ave Bike Lane Construction

This fall, Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) expects to begin construction of two-way separated bike lanes on Montgomery Lane between Woodmont Avenue and Wisconsin Avenue (MD 355) in downtown Bethesda. Their 2022 Scorecard is now out, and it's better than ever – grading 142 paper products, including private label brands from companies like Giant, Trader Joes, Wegmans and Amazon.
